# PNW Student Conference Presentation Grant Academic Year 2024 – 2025

## **Apply Here**

#### Purpose

The Student Conference Presentation Grant is available to support undergraduate and graduate students presenting projects and/or research at conferences or competitions. The maximum funding is \$400 for a presentation or competition, subject to funding availability. Students and faculty mentors should read the following guidelines before applying.

### Deadline

This is an open call grant, with a deadline of May 31<sup>st</sup>, 2025.

### Eligibility

- Students must be registered for classes and in good academic standing to apply.
- Only students are eligible for the Student Conference Presentation Grant. Funds cannot be used to support faculty.
- Total grant will not exceed \$400 for individual or multi-student presentations.
- The grant will be used to cover conference registration and other eligible expenses (e.g., PNW – approved travel expenses, materials necessary for presentation). The student's department will work with the Business Office regarding payment and/or reimbursement. Students will not receive cash.
- Students who receive this grant must agree to present their research at the PNW Days of Discovery event in the spring of 2025.

### Application

To apply, please make sure to have the following information ready.

- 1. First and Last Name.
- 2. PNW email.
- 3. Are you a graduate or undergraduate student?
- 4. Department and Major.
- 5. Faculty Mentor's Name and PNW email.
- 6. Will your mentor also attend the conference?
- 7. Name and location of the conference, provide website if applicable.
- 8. Title and date of presentation/competition.
- 9. Abstract of the paper/presentation (250 words max).
- 10. Registration confirmation, invitation, or presentation acceptance letter must be attached.
- 11. Estimated costs broken down by category (e.g., registration, travel, materials).
- 12. Is your department or college providing any support?
- 13. Signed email or letter from your faculty mentor supporting your participation at the conference must be attached.
